Sustainable peace building and conflict resolution is one of the major challenges of our time. Experience and studies show that a majority of peace agreements fail within just a few years. There is a need for a more **inclusive process** in order to make peace last.

UN Security Council Resolution 1325 stresses that equal participation of men and women in peace processes is essential to achieving lasting peace. Twelve years after its adoption, **women are still vastly underrepresented in peace and reconstruction processes.** The challenges are to turn words into deeds, theory into practice and policy into implementation.


The Kvinna till Kvinna Foundation launches the report *Equal Power – Lasting Peace* that identifies **the key obstacles to women's participation in peace processes**. It is based on the experiences and knowledge of 79 women peacebuilders, active in five different conflict contexts: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Iraq and Liberia. The report provides the EU and other regional and international organisations with recommendations on how to eliminate or reduce these obstacles.

Welcoming remarks will be held by Ms Helga Schmid, Deputy Secretary-General for Political Affairs in the EEAS and Ms Teresita Quintos-Deles, Adviser to the President on the Peace Process in the Philippines, is key note speaker. Panelists include representatives from the EEAS and the European Commission as well as academics and representatives from civil society. Closing remarks will be made by Ms Sanam Anderlini, Research Fellow, MIT Center for International Studies.
