### Identity and identity-building

- Personal / individual
- Complex, flexible, multidimensional (different spheres of belonging: individual, cultural, public, human)

### Nationality

- Birth
- Naturalisation

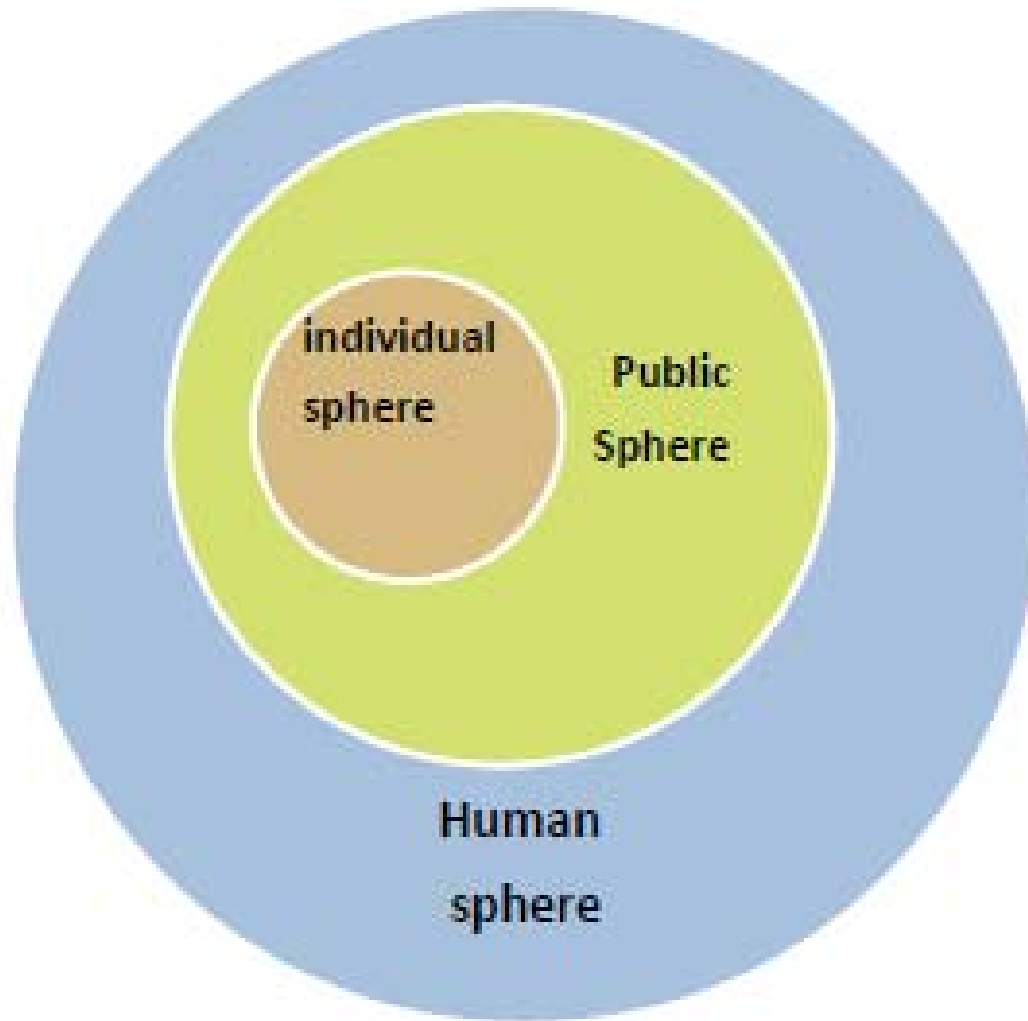
### Citizenship and citizen's rights

- Geographical area/space, Socio-political framework (City, Country, Region, Europe, world)
- Attitudes, awareness, behaviour (based on civil, political, social and cultural rights)

### Diversity set with a globalisation context of spheres of belonging

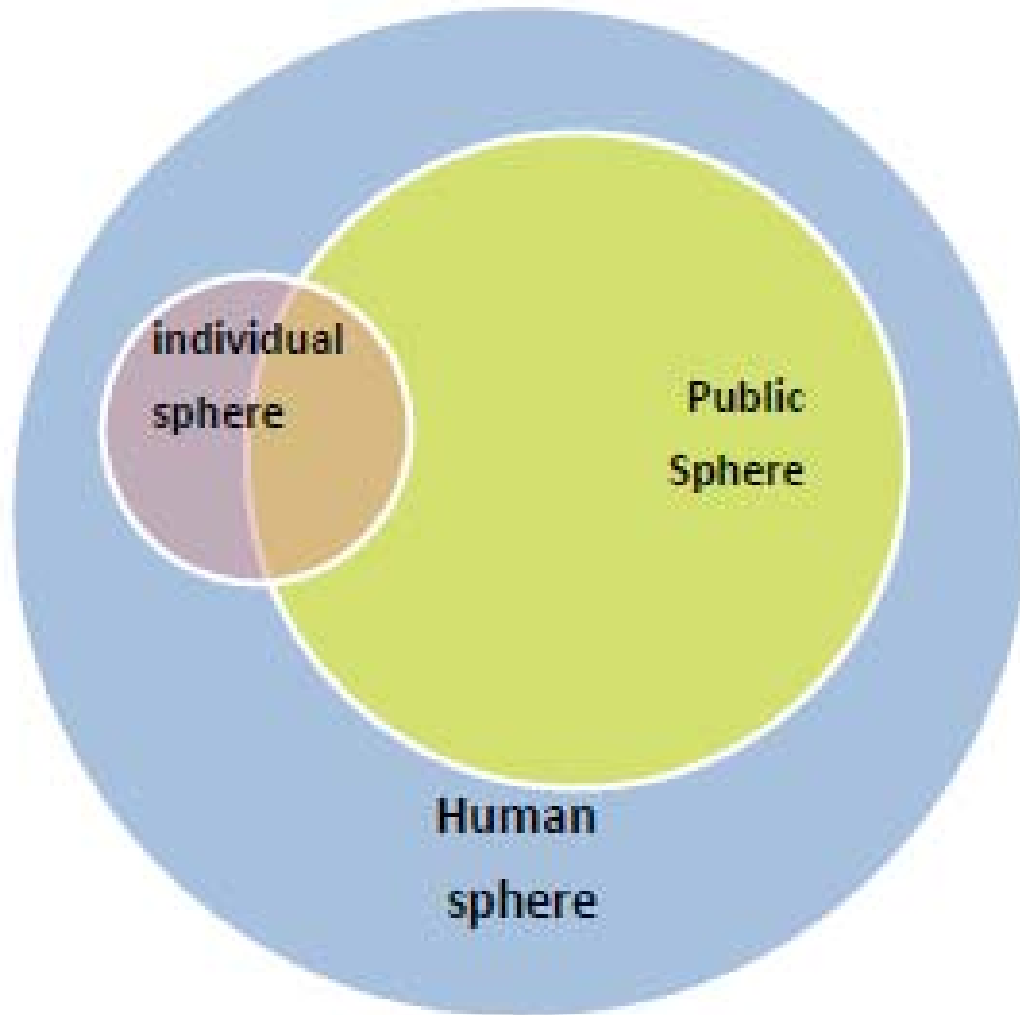
- Fact that needs to be *accepted, acknowledged, valued, promoted and managed*
- rights and responsibilities: freedoms; participation; values,

# Ideological Monolithic citizenship



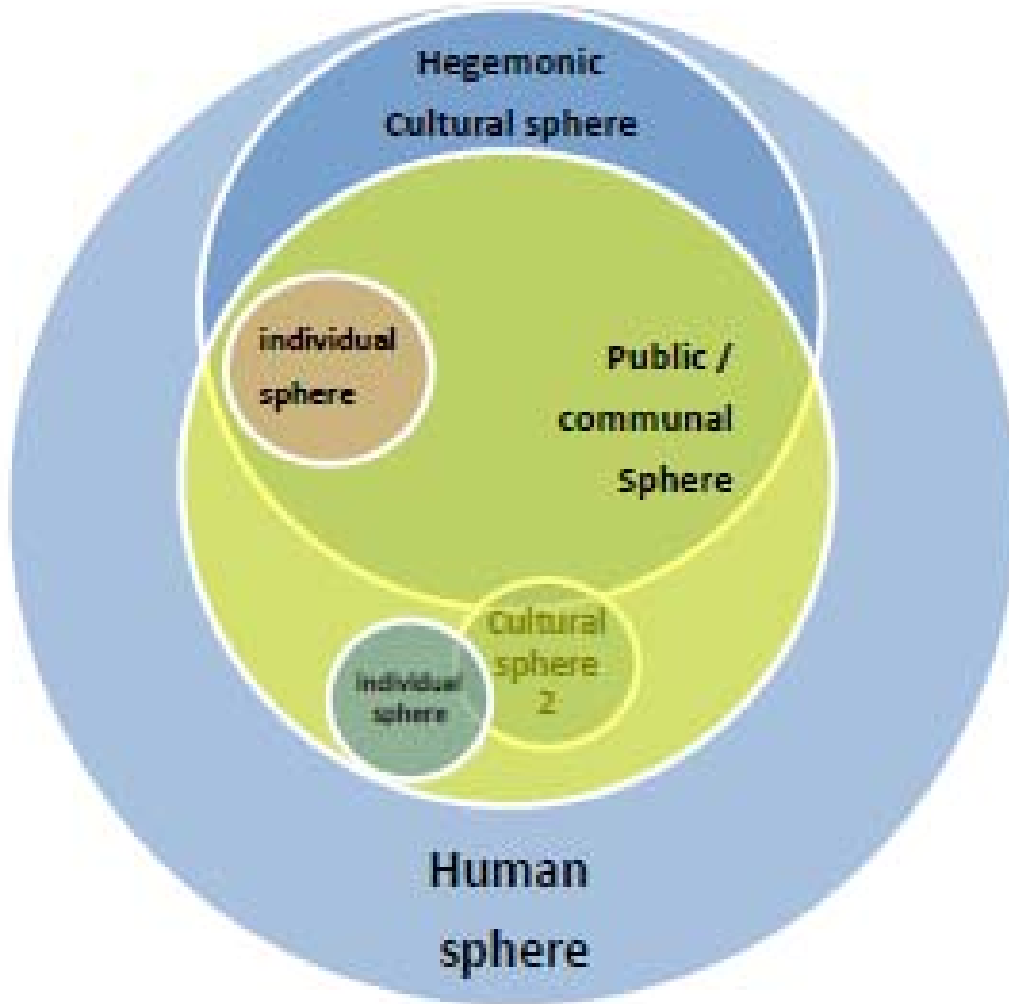
- No place for diversity
- ideology of a monolithic national identity and static public values
- No intermediate level between citizen and state
- Melting pot process

# Humanistic Citizenship



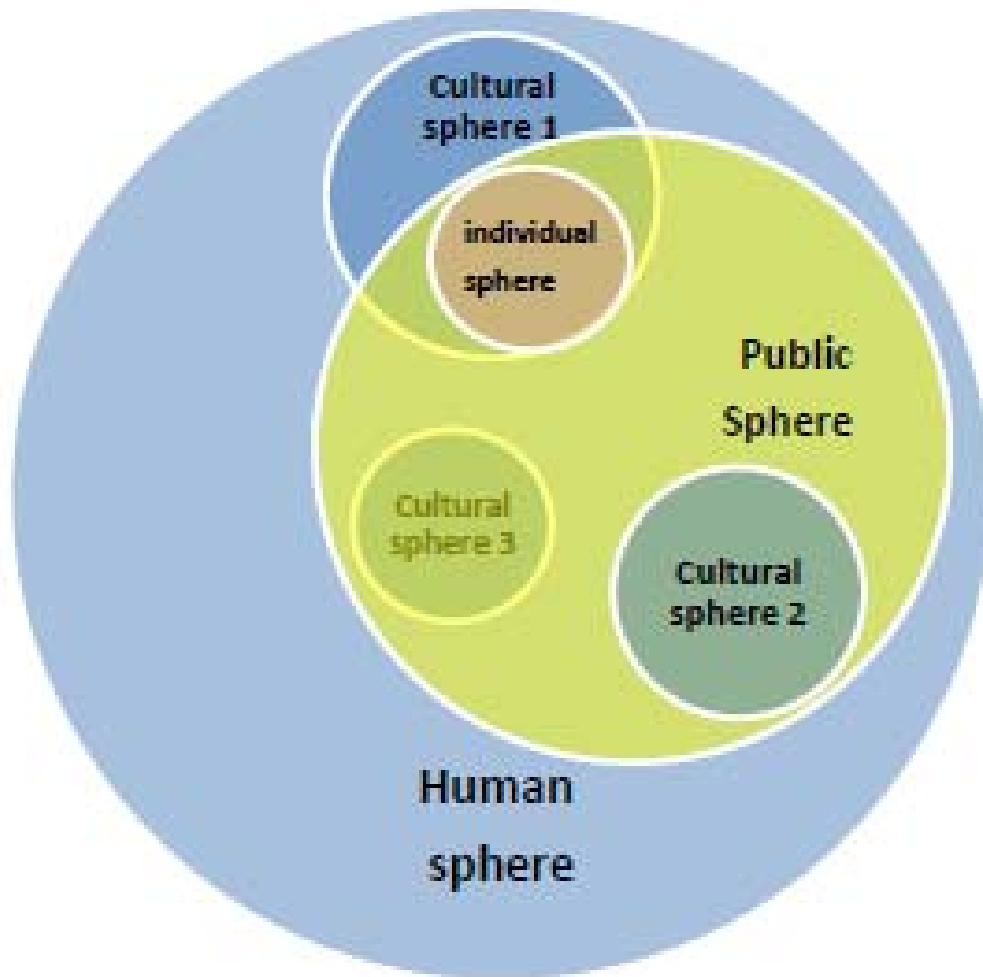
- Holistic understanding of Humanity
- Respect for the individual uniqueness
- No intermediate level between citizen and state
- “Glocal” identification process

# Communitarian Citizenship



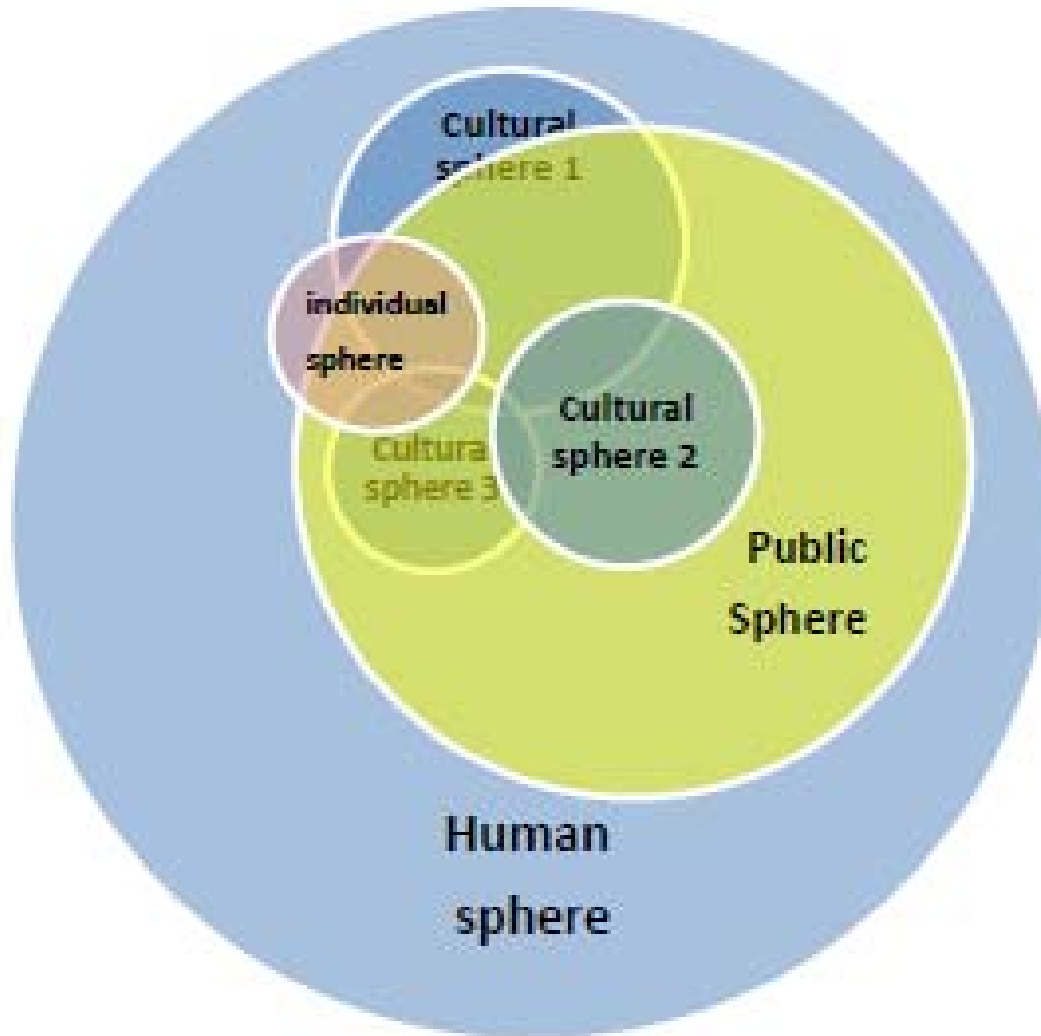
- Only one culture is recognised as reference for the public sphere
- No chance for real intercultural relations and contribution to the public life
- Citizenship and political participation are understood in a dualistic approach (with/against; within/outside)
- Communitarianism process - discrimination

# Multicultural Citizenship



- Recognition of the cultural dimension of the citizen's identity
- Respect for the cultural diversity without chance for social contribution
- tolerance from the mainstream national community towards minorities
- Risk of Ghettoisation and communitarian process and tyranny of minority on its followers

# Intercultural Citizenship



- Recognition of the cultural dimension of the citizen's identity
- Beyond tolerance, recognition of the contribution of each culture to the society
- The citizenship culture built through an ongoing intercultural dialogue and identification of shared public values
