

Elena Pariotti, female, Ph.D in Legal Philosophy, is full Professor of Legal Philosophy at the University of Padova (since 2006), where she was previously Associate Professor (since 2001) and Assistant Professor (since 1998). She teaches “Human Rights” and “Jurisprudence”.

Her main research interests focus on human rights studies; theory of international law; global justice; regulation of emerging technologies; multiculturalism and fundamental rights; legal interpretation.
