The contents of the Programme of the **STOP FOR-BEG Against emerging forms of trafficking in Italy: exploited immigrants in the international phenomenon of forced begging** (HOME/2012/ISEC/AG/TH/B/4000003934) Final Conference have been designed with the aim to disseminate outputs and deliverables of a European Commission funded project. The general framework of the Conference is "practical", meaning that prevalence will be given to the operative dimensions of the project as well as to the exchange of views with representatives of other European countries interested in the phenomenon of trafficking for the purpose of begging and to the practices developed for the contrast of this severe form of exploitation and the protection of victims.
